GOVERNANCE AND FUNDING

ACCA is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of official representatives (ORs) from member churches, committee chairs and officers. The Board and its elected officers meet monthly (except August) to review and guide assistance programs. Church and private contributions, foundations, UW/CFC designations and government grants fund ACCA. Apart from its Child Development Center, there is no paid staff and no charge for ACCA program services. As a 501(c)(3) organization, all contributions and donation of goods to ACCA are tax deductible.
