


# **Our Accomplishments**

Iln its 49th year, ACCA continued to provide high quality child care and served as the principal source of emergency assistance, including food, furniture and financial support, for our vulnerable neighbors.

The **ACCA Child Development Center** provided quality care and early education for more than 274 infants and children from low-income families.

**Family Emergency Assistance** provided \$261,107 in assistance for rent, utility bills, prescriptions and other needs to 452 households, which included 1,145 individuals.

The **Food Pantry** made 841 deliveries of food and other necessities, serving 2,348 people.

**Furniture** teams made 312 pick-ups of gently used or surplus furniture and made deliveries to 264 households, serving 911 grateful men, women and children.

**Transportation** ministry drivers provided 50 rides to and from medical appointments through April 30. Beginning May 1, the ACCA transportation joined with the Shepherd's Center of Annandale Springfield.

**Meals On Wheels** volunteers delivered 9,348 meals to 58 elderly, convalescing and disabled adults.

Housing Repair worked in partnership with Rebuilding Together and more than 70 volunteers of all ages to renovate and upgrade a single-family home and a group home for disabled adults.

The **CROP Hunger Walk** raised \$12,955 in donations for Church World Service, of which \$3,214 was returned to ACCA for our emergency assistance programs.

**Ruffing Scholarships** of \$4,000 per year for college education were provided to four local students with disabilities. The Making A Difference Award for volunteer service, which included a \$500 check, was presented to a graduating senior at Annandale High School.

**ACCA** continued to participate in Fairfax County initiatives such as prevention of hypothermia, ending homelessness, emergency preparedness and encouraging interfaith dialogue.

## About ACCA, Inc.

ACCA was named one of the best small non-profits in the Metro area by the Catalogue for Philanthropy.

ACCA's mission since 1967 has been "Doing what Jesus would do by serving our neighbors in need" in the Annandale, Lincolnia and Bailey's Crossroads areas.

There are two arms of ACCA, Inc. — the ACCA Child Development Center and ACCA Human Services.

The ACCA Child Development Center (CDC) provides high-quality early education and developmentally appropriate care for children ages 3 months to 5 years. The CDC

employs professional staff and is licensed to serve 230 children. It has a 4-Star rating from the Virginia Star Ouality Initiative.



ACCA Human Services ministries include Family Emergency Assistance, the Food Pantry, Furniture and Transportation to medical appointments. ACCA also supports Rebuilding Together, Meals on Wheels, college scholarships for students with disabilities, and the Annandale CROP Hunger Walk.

ACCA Human Services is run entirely by volunteers. In FY 2016, more than 96 percent of expenditures for these ministries went directly to helping our neighbors in need.
