

GOVERNANCE AND FUNDING

ACCA is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of Official Representatives (ORs) from member churches. Committee Chairs and officers. The Board and its elected officers meet monthly (except August) to review and guide assistance programs. Church and private contributions, foundations, UW/CFC designations and government grants fund ACCA. Apart from its Child Development Center, there is no paid staff and no charge for ACCA program services. As a 501 (c) (3) organization, all contributions and donation of goods to ACCA are tax deductible.

VOLUNTEERS

Over 700 volunteers provide the caring labor, expertise and administrative support for ACCA programs. Volunteers describe their ACCA work as grace-filled and most rewarding. Consequently, volunteers tend to maintain long-standing relationships with ACCA, serving in a variety of programs. Other volunteers perform special organizational purposes and requirements. CHILD DEVELOPMENT

ACCA Child Development Center (CDC) provides affordable, high-quality early education and developmentally appropriate care for children ages 3 months to 5 years, in a safe, healthy and diverse environment.

With a highly qualified staff, a strong curriculum, upgraded facilities, and parent involvement, the CDC prepares children to succeed in school and in life.

FURNITURE

Donated furniture is collected, warehoused and delivered free-of-charge in the Annandale, Baileys Crossroads/Culmore and Lincolnia areas of Fairfax County. Needy clients are screened through a referral system involving Fairfax County Human Service and specialized agents, churches and schools. Volunteers are needed to pick up and delivery furniture, communicate

with clients by phone (Spanish, English and other languages), and help administer the warehouse on Columbia Pike on Saturday mornings. To volunteer or to donate furniture, call (703)256-9513.

FAMILY EMERGENCIES

ACCA helps families and individuals with emergency needs for food, medicine and payment of rent or utility bills. Referrals are made through area agencies and churches.

Food is collected and delivered by volunteers from ACCA's Food Pantry, which is supplied by area churches, organizations, stores and individual donors. The annual CROP Walk supports family emergency needs.

TRANSPORTATION

Volunteers are needed to transport local residents who lack affordable public or private transportation to medical, dental and therapy appointments. Churches take turns for a week every three months to provide transportation to medical appointments for elderly and disabled persons. To serve as a church coordinator or driver, call (703) 256-2775.

HOUSING REPAIR AND RENOVATION

ACCA collaborates with Rebuilding Together (formerly the Christmas in April Program) to repair or renovate residences. Leadership, food, funds and volunteers are provided for this all-out effort to improve local homes. Volunteers are needed to work on site, donate food for workers, serve as house captains, and assist with public relations. For

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

ACCA grants scholarship assistance (up to four years) to disabled Fairfax County high school seniors who are pursuing further education or training. To contribute to the fund or identify high school seniors, call (703) 256-7749.

MEALS ON-WHEELS

The Meal-On-Wheels program serves elderly shut-ins who are unable to shop or cook. ACCA coordinates drivers who serve people in Annandale. Drivers pick up food at United Baptist in Annandale. For weekday (Monday thru Friday) food delivery or volunteering, call (703) 941-9128 For weekend delivery of meals, call (703) 256-9513.

SHELTER ASSISTANCE

ACCA provides rental assistance for guests leaving these shelters and helps recruit volunteers for Shelter House, a non-profit facility that provides shelter for families and Bailey's Crossroads Community Shelter for single adults.
